Groveway Timeline

2008

Completed the Roswell Town Center Atlanta Street Livable Center Initiates (LCI) study which included conceptual plans for the boundary area including the Groveway Community — in the LCI this area was called the Arts Village.

February 2009

The City received an Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) Community Choice grant which provides technical assistance. The purpose of this assistance was to build on the conceptual plan by exploring the design elements of the Groveway Community through a design Charrette.

City Council appointed a Stakeholder Committee to work with ARC and City staff to design the Charrette – the Committee worked approximately 5 months through monthly meetings. Twenty-two members sat on this committee.

Sept. 24-25, 2009

Charrette was held. Seven architects volunteered time to sit with the community and stakeholders to design their vision for the Groveway Community. Approximately 30 to 35 residents and stakeholders participated over the two day period.

Nov. 2009

ARC completed a report of the Charrette.

December 2009

Community meeting held with the Groveway Community Group - approximately 7 participants

Jan. 11, 2010

ARC and Staff presented the findings of the Groveway Charrette to the Mayor and City Council at Committee — Report included three possible options for implementing the vision - staff was asked to meet with the Community again.

March 2010

The City received a second ARC Community Choices grant to provide assistance in developing the implementation tool.

April 2010

Community Meetings held at Zion Missionary Baptist Church (15 to 18 residents participated) and Pleasant Hill Church (approximately 13 residents participated).

April 2010

Returned to Mayor and Council to discuss the Charrette report, the results of the Community meetings, and the next steps. Three options were presented — overlay, design guidelines, and form-based — Mayor and Council consensus was to pursue a hybrid-form based type of implantation tools

June/July 2010

Two work sessions were held with Mayor and City Council discussing the particulars of form-based — what it is, how it functions, and what it means. Again, the consensus was to pursue some type of form-based tool.

August 2010 A second Stakeholder Committee was created by Mayor and Council to

work with ARC and Staff to facilitate the development of the Groveway Hybrid Form-Based Code - Committee worked over a year to create the $\,$

document.

Sept. 2010-Oct. 2011 Twelve Stakeholder meetings (open to the public) held.

Oct. 2011 Final meeting of the Stakeholder Committee.

Nov. 11 2011 Community Meeting held at the CDA. Stakeholder Committee member,

Booker Nuckles personally distributed flyers throughout the neighborhood. – (approximately 25 residents and stakeholders

participated)

Dec. 2011 Committee discussion regarding Groveway Hybrid Form Based Code.

Jan. 2012 Item initiated by Mayor and City Council.

Jan. 2012 Discussed at Council Work Session.

Jan. 2012 Staff offered to meet with individual Council Members regarding the

proposal.

Feb. 2012 Planning Commission, Design Review Board and Historic Preservation

Committee reviewed and moved item forward to Mayor and Council.

March 12, 2012 First Reading of the Groveway Form-Based Code at Mayor and Council

meeting.

March 26, 2012 Special Called Work Session – Groveway Form-Based Code
