

**Draft Substantial Amendment**  
**Roswell 2019 Annual Action Plan**  
**February 22, 2024**

This substantial amendment to the City of Roswell’s 2019 Annual Action Plan (AAP) reallocates unexpended prior-year Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds in the amount of \$37,901.04 to the Roswell Recreation, Parks, Historic, and Cultural Affairs Department for the Roswell Adaptive Friendship Camp. The CDBG-CV funds were awarded to the City of Roswell through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. Funds are intended to benefit low to moderate income persons and help prevent, prepare for, or respond to infectious diseases like the coronavirus.

The Roswell Adaptive Friendship camp will take place in the summer of 2024 at the Waller Park Recreation Center. The day camp provides learning and social opportunities for children and teens with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). The participants have a higher risk of contracting infectious diseases and are still overcoming the impacts of the isolation experienced during the COVID pandemic.
